In 62% of communities, many in rural areas, public libraries are the **ONLY PLACE** where people can access the Internet for free



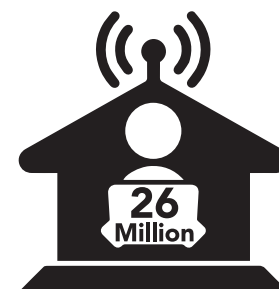
Highspeed Internet in public libraries supports:

The federal E-rate program plays a role by providing libraries with discounts on Internet costs:

	Average Monthly Cost ³	Annual Cost Per Library	Annual Estimated Statewide Costs	Estimated Statewide 75% E-Rate Discount ⁴
100 Megabits per second² 508 Small Texas Libraries (Serving <50K)	\$2,000	\$24,000	\$12,192,000	\$3,048,000
1 Gigabit per second² 76 Large Texas Libraries (Serving 50K+)	\$4,000	\$48,000	\$3,846,000	\$912,000
