

#### Purpose of TLA Reading Lists

Reading lists curated by Texas Library Association members are designed to highlight current books that are of commendable quality, creativity, and have potential appeal to the readers for whom they are selected. Included titles are intended for consideration only and not meant to be a purchase recommendation. When purchasing materials, librarians should always follow their own local collection development policies.

Responsibility for selection

TLA reading lists are curated by TLA members who are professional librarians from various library types and geographic areas of the state and have experience working with the audience for whom the list is intended.


General guidelines

All books under final consideration will be read in their entirety by all committee members.

All books selected for inclusion must comply with all applicable state and federal laws and regulations.



# Organizational structure



### Recommendation

**Reorganize TLA's governance structure** so that all reading list committees come under the supervision of the **Reading List Coordination Committee**, with committee appointments to be managed collaboratively between **RLCC, CRT, PLD, and YART Executive Boards**.
