89th Texas Legislature is in Session

On Tuesday, January 14, the 89<sup>th</sup> Texas Legislature convened in Austin to begin their regular 140-day session. To-date, 2406 bills have been filed, and TLA is tracking 34 that directly impact libraries or librarians. The first order of business for the Texas House of Representatives was to elect a speaker. The race for **Speaker of** the House was hard fought, with Representative Dustin Burrows (R-Lubbock) defeating Rep. David Cook (R-Mansfield) by a vote of 88-55. Lt. Gov. Dan Patrick will likely appoint Senate Committee chairs and members this week, and the Speaker will appoint House Committee chairs and members by the end of the month.
