The Texas Bluebonnet Award (TBA) is one of the most prestigious children's choice literary awards in the United States. Each year, 20 books (for grades 3 – 6) are chosen for the Texas Bluebonnet Award List. Schools and libraries around the state participate in the program, encouraging students to read a minimum of five books from the list. In January, students vote for their favorite title. The author and illustrator of the book receiving the most votes wins the award which is presented at the Texas Bluebonnet Award presentation held during the TLA Annual Conference in the spring.
