St. Philip's College - comments on Thin Client:

One problem has been students not being able to print their scores to online tests. They needed the ETS Online Testing Browser loaded on the computers to work. In addition: PDFs take a long time to load (several minutes); Printing PDFs takes an extremely long time and/or times out; GoPrint is not recognizing several document types when printing from the desktops (PDFs, web pages, etc.). "Format Unsupported" error; Frequently will not read external USB drives; No DVD/CD drives. Nursing, allied health, and natural science students are often required to use DVDs issued by their programs and found in their textbooks for their courses; Several instances where the terminal "shuts down" on its own (gives a "Session timed out" message) even when someone is actively using the terminal; No working system to monitor problematic usage or to see when a patron is needing help as we are able to do on the desktops. Viewing briefly what a user is doing helps us see when printing or research help is needed; Monitor height is not adjustable - ADA compliance?; Can't create or manage folders in flash/external drives; Often when "shut down" by student with windows open/logged in, will "reboot" with same windows and accounts open; They do not separate usage stats among colleges, campuses. Impossible to collect data necessary to make data-driven decisions; No DVD/CD drives available to students when adaptive technology computers are in use; Still haven't installed a working system to monitor problematic usage / no existing practice to consistently enforce district, college, and department policy and procedure; Students report that some testing through Canvas takes 5 minutes per page to load
