Seventeen-year-old Layla and her parents are taken from their home and forced to live in an internment camp with other Muslim American citizens. Layla uses her voice to fight for their rights and freedom.

**Shout** by Lauri Halse Anderson, published by Viking Books for Young Readers, 2019.

Anderson's memoir in verse stunningly weaves the story of her life and her experiences with sexual abuse.

Unique characters, complex plot, and beautiful language make this book a stunner.

Lovely War by Julie Berry, published by Viking Childrens Books, 2019.

Narrated by the Greek gods of love, war, music, and death, *Lovely War* chronicles the epic romance of two sets of star-crossed lovers as they experience the horrors of World War I.

*Unbroken: 13 Stories Starring Disabled Teens* edited by Marieke Nijkamp, published by Farrar Straus Giroux, 2018. Written by disabled creators, these eclectic stories feature teens who happen to experience various disabilities but refuse to let themselves be defined by those disabilities.

Floyd is on his way to becoming a tennis champion. But when Mike, an imaginary person, shows up, Floyd has to think about what he wants instead of just what his parents expect him to do.

Neanderthal Opens the Door to the Universe by Preston Norton, published by Hyperion, 2018.

Cliff a.k.a. Neanderthal is just trying to survive high school and, despite his size, not draw any unnecessary attention. Why would he agree to help the football player who gave him his cruel nickname complete a mission from God? Realistic Fiction

A talented pickpocket trying to make more of herself is thrust into a riveting whodunit as she and her former-target-turned-partner try to prevent the murder of the four queens that rule their nation.

Stevenson gives a vivid account of his work with the criminal justice system and describes the disturbing racial and socioeconomic inequalities in our prisons, especially the large number of poor and black prisoners without any legal representation on death row in the U.S.

Radio personality West McCray decides to do a *Serial*-type podcast on Sadie, a missing girl who is trying to find out who murdered her sister. Told in alternating chapters between the podcast and Sadie's story, this mystery will keep you on the edge of your seat.

Laura Dean Keeps Breaking Up With Me by Mariko Tamaki, published by First Second, 2019.

Seventeen-year-old Freddy finds herself in an on-again, off-again relationship with charismatic Laura Dean. She knows she needs to break things off so she can get on with her life, but can she?

Secrets of the Casa Rosada by Alex Temblador, published by Arte Publico, 2018.

Being the granddaughter of a well-known healer whom she has only just met, Martha is thrown into a world and a life that is foreign to her. As she assimilates into her new home and her new school, she discovers things about herself and her family that she never knew.
