The program offers parents and caregivers expert tips and resources for children prenatal to 5 right at their fingertips.

Bright by Text helps parents and caregivers by illustrating fun and easy activities, providing positive parenting tips and resources, tips for aiding a child's physical development, and much more. The program is proven to build nurturing caregiver-child relationships, and positively impact a child's healthy development and acheal



impact a child's healthy development and school readiness.

In addition to expert content, Bright by Text includes messages about events and resources specific to the local community, like library storytime, free museum days, health clinics, and preschool open enrollment periods.

To sign up, parents and caregivers with children under 8 can text the word #TexasKIDS to 2-74448 or <u>register online</u>. They will receive 2 to 5 text messages per week, and each message includes a link to a landing page with more detail, short modeling videos, and links to related resources.

Virtual Annual Assembly: Free, Register Now


