


If you could design your dream room, what would be in your room? This <u>video</u> will teach you about room design or blueprints to help you gather ideas to design your own bedroom or space.

What could be behind the door? Draw or <u>print</u> your own key hole and imagine what other things could be behind Manu's door.




ACTIVITY 2




ACTIVITY 2




ACTIVITY 2




ACTIVITY 2



ACTIVITY 2

FROG LIFE CYCLE

Explore the life cycle of a tree frog from egg to tadpole to adult. Draw or use pictures to sequence the different stages of a frog's life and discuss the changes that happen during each stage.
