
Midwifery & Crime


Audience: Adults interested in medical crimes, alternative medicine or natural childbirthing

Programs:

- The History of Midwifery: A lecture or presentation by a historian, midwife, or medical professional on the evolution of midwifery practices throughout history
- Modern Midwifery: Choices and Care: Invite a panel of midwives to discuss the role of modern midwives, the services they provide, and the benefits of midwifery care.
- **Pregnancy and Postpartum Health** Offer a series of workshops or classes on prenatal and postpartum health, covering topics such as nutrition, exercise, and emotional well-being. Invite healthcare professionals, such as midwives, nurses, and lactation consultants, to lead the sessions.













Extinction/Survival

Programs:

- Dino digs or bring a dinosaur exhibit/info sessions
- Prepping sessions: tips and tricks to prep for the worst (supplies, how-tos, etc.) or create a go-bag program. Collaborate with local Eagle Scouts, Girl Scouts, Camping groups, etc.
- Basic Life Skills program series

















How-To Guides

Programs:













Paris

- Magical Salon series: feature fantasy novels, books about magicians, and magic, etc. Could include discussions, readings, music performances, and games.


















Journeys/Male Bonding

Programs:


- 'Man Cave' book club (books featuring strong male protagonists)

- Partner with scouts or other youth programs to offer programming supportive of merit badges or similar skills




- Brotherhood & Bonds: explore the complexities of male relationships

- Stories of Strength: fathers/sons supporting each other through hard times















Plant Power

- Present a series of garden-focused programs: Pollinators, Container gardening, Herbs, Preserving food, Native plant landscaping, etc. Partner with Master Gardeners, Master Naturalists, and/or the Native Plant Society of Texas
- Community Connections: Plan/participate in a tree planting event, BioBlitz, community garden, etc.













Senior Citizens

Audience: Adults planning for the future and adults with elderly parents.


Programs:

- Legacy Writing & Genealogy: Guided workshop for seniors to write personal narratives, memoirs, or letters to loved ones. Encourages documentation of life experiences.
- End-of-Life Planning: Partner with legal & financial experts to discuss wills, estate planning, power of attorney, and advance directives. Provide/create checklists for the process.
- Social & Volunteerism Fair: Showcase volunteer opportunities, social groups, and resources for seniors to stay engaged and connected. Include senior mentorship programs.

Programs:


- Scrabble night; create your own crossword puzzles or crossword competitions



Programs:


- Self-defense strategies/police officer as a speaker



Vulnerable Populations


Audience: Adults interested in true crime, criminal psychology or contemporary issues affecting young people / indigenous populations.

Programs:


- Missing & Murdered Indigenous Persons (MMIP) Awareness & Prevention: Host educational sessions to raise awareness about the crisis of MMIP, discuss risk factors, safety planning, and available resources for families and individuals. Partner with MMIP advocacy groups.
- Healthy Relationships & Consent Education: Facilitate workshops on healthy relationships, consent, boundaries, and identifying red flags in a way that is culturally appropriate and addresses potential power imbalances and historical context.

Book Display Ideas:


- Feature books addressing issues faced by vulnerable youth, such as bullying, poverty, mental health challenges, and foster care. Include information on local youth support services.
- Showcase books that promote empathy, understanding, and allyship towards vulnerable populations. Include books on social justice, human rights, and overcoming prejudice.

Heists

Audience: Adults interested in heists, history, and adventure.

Programs:

- Heist film series show famous heist movies from different time periods
- Conduct a creative writing workshop focused on heist stories. Learn about plotting, character development, and creating suspenseful scenes.
- Escape Room Challenge set up in the library with a heist theme. Solve puzzles to pull off the heist and escape within a set time limit.
- Heist Themed Trivia Night Questions relating to famous heists in history, literature, and film.








Read-A-Like Titles


Audience: Readers interested in human behavior or psychological themes

Programs:

- Escape Room challenge Create an escape room based on themes from both books. Participants can solve puzzles related to memory, perception, and cognitive biases to "escape."
 - Include clues and challenges inspired by the plot of "Listen for the Lie" and the concepts from "The Age of Magical Overthinking."
- CSI Mystery Night Solve a crime together with a psychological theme






Audience: Adults that Like History, Women's History, Women in War


Programs:


- Living history talks or lectures Have veterans, who are willing speak and record their war experiences or professors from area colleges.

- Encourage patrons to create art or junk journal entries based on the novels
- Film Screenings The Vietnam War Documentary or Saving Private Ryan
- Letter writing campaign to the troops, service project to send care packagees




Audience: Those that like a strong female protagonist, cultural enthusiasts, and social justice advocates

Programs:


- Historical Context Lectures: Provide lectures on the historical periods and social issues depicted in both books, such as cartel violence in Mexico and Tejano history in Texas.
- Cultural Exhibits: Set up exhibits showcasing Mexican and Tejano art, history, and traditions, providing a visual and interactive experience.
- Resilience Workshops: Offer workshops on building resilience and coping with trauma, inspired by the characters' experiences in the novels.

 Courage and resilience, cultural heritage, true crime and justice, multigenerational stories








Read-A-Like Titles


Audience: Patrons that are dealing or interested in grief, hope

Programs:

- Travel Writing Workshop: Host a workshop where participants can learn the art of travel writing, inspired by Schaap's journey.
- Map Your Journey: Create a program where participants can map out their own significant journeys and share stories.
- Memoir Writing Class: Offer a class on memoir writing, encouraging participants to explore their own life stories.
- Mental Health Awareness Event: Host an event focusing on the themes of resilience and healing, which are central to Maynard's book.
