Both sets of teens in their respective timelines work against time to try and reverse the small changes they made had disastrous outcomes.

Through interviews with teachers, friend's moms, and their sister Ollie starts to understand that there is no one way to grow into womanhood. In the midst of this search for clarity Ollie befriends a group of queer kids at her school who show them the joy that can be found in self-discovery and living a life unbound by others' expectations.

Ollie's humorous and searching voice make this an essential coming of age story for any young person struggling to live authentically in a world that seeks to put people into boxes.
